


HOW to SKIN CANCER

HOW TO CHECK YOUR SKIN

Do checkups in front of a full-length mirror. Check all parts of your body, from head to toe.




TAKE CLOSE UP PHOTOS OF YOUR SKIN

If you have a lot of moles, take digital photos of them each month. These can help you see if any moles change over time.
